



BOARD REPORT MAY 9, 2024

The Board of Directors of CSA Fraternal Life met on Thursday, May 9, 2024. All Directors were present along with President John Kielczewski and Secretary/Treasurer Nick Kosmas.

Molly May, who divides her time between Fraternal, Sales, and Marketing, reported that our presence on Facebook and Instagram has increased. This helps promote CSA, so be sure to send lodge happenings and pictures for Facebook or Instagram and "like" and "share" these postings.

We had a Zoom meeting with representatives of Data Guard, our cybersecurity partner. They explained that the company focuses on managed detection. The dark web has changed tactics and doesn't want to shut down your computer, they want to stay on and mine your data. Data Guard detects those entities trying to enter our system through phishing attempts. Due to Brother Kosmas' vigilance, we have a clean environment. In fact, they said our company is boring. We appreciate Brother Kosmas' efforts in keeping our data secure. A webinar is scheduled at our November meeting to update us on various scams.

Brother Kosmas has also been investigating hardware and software systems since ours is at the point of needing updating. Unfortunately, this is not an inexpensive expenditure, but he will be reporting back to us either before or at the August meeting.

Brother Kielczewski told us that the State of Illinois audit is complete, and he will be receiving the final report in the days ahead.

There was a Zoom meeting scheduled with our auditor

Steven Niedenberger from the Hosack Group on our year end audit. In their letter to the Directors, they reported that there were no issues and we were given the highest rating. There were no weaknesses in our internal controls and there were no disagreements with the officers concerning financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matters. They also reported that last year was a difficult year for many fraternals because of the changes in reserving requirements. Due to the Federal Reserve keeping interest rates high, insurance companies are required to reserve more to cover any eventuality that might occur.

When filling out forms for the Home Office – for the Photo Contest, CSA Serves, Bowling Contest, etc. – be sure to include your name, address, phone number, and lodge information. This should also be included with the information sent for the "In Memoriam" section.

There will be a Halloween and a Christmas contest again this year at the Home Office. It is early but we wanted to give you a heads-up to start making the decorations, so they are all ready when the holiday rolls around. Prizes are awarded.

Fun times are planned for the Get-Together in Nashville this August. There will be an opportunity to visit many of the famous places and country music locations. So, grab your cowboy boots and hats and join us. Thanks to everyone at the Home Office for your efforts in putting this together.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be August 1, prior to the Get-Together. Please let your Director know of any concerns.

MESSAGE FROM THE SECRETARY/TREASURER

SUMMER IS HERE!

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I write this article, we are about to celebrate Memorial Day. As a kid it meant something different than it does now. I remember as a kid it meant school was almost over, and summer had unofficially started. This year Memorial Day was on May 27th, which is our 34th wedding anniversary.

The weather is getting warmer and more predictable in Lombard and surrounding areas!

School is almost done for the year, vacations are being planned, gardens are planted, pools are opening, and Father's Day is coming. The Nashville Get-Together is almost here!

What are the origins of Father's Day? On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia church sponsored the nation's first event explicitly in honor of fathers, a Sunday sermon in memory of the 362 men who had died in the previous December's explosions at the Fairmont Coal Company mines in Monongah. But it was a one-time commemoration and not an annual holiday.

The next year, a Spokane, Washington, woman named Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, tried to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She went to local churches, the YMCA, shopkeepers, and government officials to drum up support for her idea, and she was successful: Washington State celebrated the nation's first statewide Father's Day on June 19, 1910.

Slowly, the holiday spread.

In 1972, in the middle of a presidential re-election campaign, Richard Nixon signed a proclamation making Father's Day a federal holiday.

This year, Father's Day is bittersweet for my family. This will be the first year that my dad will not be with us on Father's Day and his birthday (he passed this past January and would have turned 95 on June 12th).

As fathers, we want to teach and protect our children. The best way to do that is by actions, not just words, setting good examples for them. Lisa and I have two sons, now 31 and 29. We are proud of the fine young men they have become.

June is also Men's Health Month. Set a good example by getting your annual physical, to get advice or get early treatment for any illness or disease.

It's also important that we protect our family's financial health by reviewing our insurance needs. Your agent or the Home Office can assist with this "check-up".

During the past month, I have attended several lodge and DC events. It's always fun to see familiar faces, share stories, and eat some yummy treats!

Happy Start to Summer

Greetings everyone,

My Junior year of college is finally complete! Finals went really well, and I'm all set in terms of housing and classes for the upcoming fall semester. Until then, I'm back in Minnesota with the Forest Service. I just completed my first week back, and it was celebrated by a massive solar storm and incredible northern lights. I've seen them multiple times before, but this time was particularly spectacular. My mom and sister could even see them from our driveway back home in Detroit!

In terms of on-the-job activities, this week involved a mixture of working at

the front desk issuing entry permits for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and going out into the field and flagging the boundaries for timber sale units. I have the same room in the employee bunkhouse I had last summer, which is nice because it faces a pond that is visited daily by deer, foxes, turtles, and many bird species. This year we're working on a project to introduce a greater variety of native marsh species to the pond. Unfortunately, that means hacking out large sections of cattails to expose some soil. It doesn't sound that bad at first, but my allergies have been kicking me in the butt after inhaling all the cattail fluff that flies around as I'm



chopping them down.

A more fun, and less allergy-provoking, trip I got to take during the week was driving to a local school with a few of my coworkers and giving a presentation to the students on white pine trees and how to plant them. Our silviculture department was even able to donate enough seedlings for all of the students to take one home to plant themselves. Next week, I'll be able to take another educational trip to Duluth to attend an event dedicated to educating the public on the importance of rivers and how watersheds contribute to the overall quality of water in Minnesota and everywhere else.

In addition to work, I also started volunteering again at the Cook Country Connection Farm, which is a petting farm open to the public during the summer. One of their goats had quadruplets last week, and I spent a lot of time cuddling the babies. One of them, May, is itty bitty now and was only 1.6 pounds at birth. She fell asleep on my lap for a good while. It made me especially happy considering how much I miss my pets back home.

Another one of the momma goats is about ready to have her kids as well, and the farm owner, Lois, is nice enough where she said she'll text me when the laboring process begins. That way I might have the chance to help with the birth! While that may not sound appealing to a lot of folks, I think it would be a really cool opportunity.

Looking forward through the next month, I'm hoping for minimal bug bites, maximum sunshine, and lots more baby animals! I'll be sure to update you all on how my wishes are (or are not) fulfilled.

Lodge Mile-Hi Czechs No. 432, Lakewood, Colorado - While gifting each member with a long stemmed rose (It's a manita thing...), Dr. Renee Fajardo, winner of the Rex Morgan award for Community Service, joined Lodge Mile-Hi Czechs and their guests for a heart-warming and tummy-warming session about preserving food and food stories. As the lodge members chewed on crusty pizza, Dr. Renee asked each member to relate stories about eating from their childhoods. She emphasized that as cultures change, and as cooks change, cuisine evolves as well. Renee herself is a mix of heritages from Southern Colorado, and elsewhere, known as manita. She gave us our job: to tell a story, then "pop like corn," to pick another person at the table to share their story.

Chief kernel among us, Irma Farrell began with the 100 percent Czech story of her Nebraska youth which has guided our lodge forward to many a fine repast. With both sets of grandparents of Czech extraction (James Anton and Molaceck Drahota, paternal and Mary Shimerka Roh, maternal), Irma told tales of bread dumplings and potato dumplings, roast pork, sauerkraut, and kolaches. For one family reunion, she did, indeed, compile a cookbook.

Guest Amy Doe-Torres popped to the warm remembrance of the cooking of her beloved nanny, Mrs. King, or "Kingy," as her mother-cook was a professional woman away at work. She mentioned the heavy Bohemian emphasis of her grandparents (Gerald S. Maresh, M.D. and Ethel Maresh) and was "shocked" to find, in later life, that her maternal grandmother (Ethel Nelson) was of Swedish/German heritage. Her husband's grandmother (Alice Gallegos) was of Hispanic heritage, however, and at Amy's request, Alice gifted her the recipe for green chili and tortillas. Now, said Amy, no Thanksgiving is complete without

which one mother-cook made "homemade" T.V. dinners, complete with aluminum trays! She called Amy a manita
since the Torres family comes from the
land-grant Spaniards of Southern

He confirmed his vegetarianism, but remembered fondly his trips in the 70s to Czechoslovakia. Sandra Doe remembered the family enthusiasm of "short baloneys from Cedar Rapids, Iowa and pivo (beer)." Mary Camp, of Slovak descent, swirled around in the oil of "American food," and she only learned of her heritage from her mother's (Pat Kenning) joining of Lodge Mile-Hi Czechs. Still she recalled a fondness for sauerkraut, preferably roasted with spareribs and brown sugar on top.

Maryellen Vialpando presented a Nebraska "all popped" finish to our stories: her own mother-cook did not like to cook and went to work instead. Still, Maryellen had both sets of grandparents (Irish Margaret and John Lane and Czech Emma and Frank Hruska) until she was twenty-five. Both grandmas contributed to her own cooking and story prowess: she wrote *Babi's Cookbook* and put in pictures of both grandmas. She also told the story of her husband George Vialpando's uncle going to the library to "prove" his Spanish heritage, as he was challenged by his wife. And so he proved it and made a book of heritage.

Dr. Renee* pointed out that food and food stories preserve continuity, and they touch us: "it's the ability of the soul that breaks down barriers and takes us to 'me and home and love.'" They give us joy and delight.

Ken Dvorsky reported on the Bohemian National Cemetery and ceremonies to be held on Memorial Day to dedicate the WWII War Memorial.



Jan will also request "Thank a Driver" gift cards to hand out to our member's drivers. We held a moment




